From Fr. Bill

Sacraments are visible signs of invisible realities. They are outward signs instituted by Christ to give grace. Sacraments are for the members of the church of God to enhance, repair and strengthen their relationship with God and His church. The sacrament which opens the door to others is baptism with the person's acceptance and formally embracing our baptismal promises regarding what the church believes, practices and teaches. ("I do.") Parents are allowed to make these promises for children who have not yet reached the age of reason.

There are also "sacramentals." The ashes of Ash Wednesday, the palms of Palm Sunday, holy water, rosaries, crucifixes, wedding rings, statues and medals of saints, holy cards and candles placed before our Lady, the Sacred Heart or a saint's image or statue all fall into this category called sacramentals.

A sacramental is anything set apart or blessed by the Church to help us to focus, to encourage good thoughts and to increase devotion. For some of these sacramentals there is an associated use or action. For example, with holy water we are encouraged to dip our fingers into the holy water and then do the sign of the cross which is a public and conscious acknowledgement of God and recalls our baptism. Yet, because it is a sacramental, even non-believers are welcome to pray the rosary, use holy water, receives ashes on Ash Wednesday or collect palms on Palm Sunday. Who knows? Maybe the use of this sacramental may actually prepare the way for them to seek membership in the church?

In many cases, things used as sacramentals are blessed: rosaries, medals, scapulars, bibles, ashes and palms. It is common for Catholics, when they receive a new rosary or medal or scapular, to take it to their parish priest to ask him to bless it. Yet please note, you can still use a rosary or read a bible before having them blessed. The blessing signifies the use to which the item will be used in the service of the worship of God.

"Set apart or blessed by God" is a part of the reason many people choose to have their home or car blessed. As domestic church our homes are a place where we gather to pray, read scripture and ask that Jesus Spirit be dwelling among us. Cars can be a place of prayer. Only God knows how many rosaries I have prayed when driving. I sometimes prayer the Liturgy of the Hours along

with my phone application. I also sometimes sign Catholic Hymns or listen to Catholic Radio 930am. I have even composed songs as I drive... being compelled to pull off to the side of the road and record the words and melody that God has placed in my heart.

Although sacraments such as receiving the Eucharist (communion) are only available to baptized Catholics, anyone may receive or use a sacramental as they are not a sacrament. So, with Ash Wednesday coming soon, know that all are welcome to receive ashes.

As Lent is on the horizon, I thought it would be good to review the rules for fasting and abstinence in the United States. Every person 14 years or older must abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday, Good Friday, and all the Fridays of Lent. Every person between the age of 18 and 59 (beginning of 60th year) must fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday.

When fasting, a person is permitted to eat one full meal, as well as two smaller meals that together are not equal to a full meal. To abstain means that you don't partake of something. The norms concerning abstinence from meat are binding upon members of the Roman Catholic Church from age 14 onwards. So although we may "graduate" from being REQUIRED to fast, abstaining from meat is something we are all able to do.

And regarding Fridays throughout the year: All Catholics are obliged to do some type of penance in honor of Good Friday. (Penance = special devotion to prayer, works of charity, and/or denying themselves of something) It MAY BE fasting and abstaining from meat. Yet, it also MAY BE doing works of charity and exercises of piety. If outside of Lent I make the choice to not abstain from meat on a Friday, I need to make sure I ADD additional prayer (e.g. Divine Mercy Chaplet, Stations of the Cross, a visit to the Blessed Sacrament, the Rosary) OR I need to ADD an act of charity/mercy (e.g. feeding, clothing, caring, visiting, teaching) OR I could deny myself something I usually enjoy (e.g. Social Media, Television, Coffee, Alcohol... or only drink water for beverage).

If you are looking for actions of charity or mercy consider making time to become an Angel and visit the home-bound. "See how they love one-another" is an important part of evangelization. Light for the world needs to be seen. Have a blessed week.
