From Fr. Bill

One of St. John Bosco's warnings was, "Don't let the better become the enemy of the good." If only we could get everyone involved and found a date where everyone could attend and found the perfect.... In this world there are not perfect people. We all have flaws which allow God's grace to transform us. If wait to act until everything is "just right" you'll be waiting until Christ's return in glory. If it is worth doing... if it needs to be done... what are we really waiting for? And if it can only be done your way, then I hope you have broad shoulders as you will have to do it alone or exhaust yourself in supervising every detail. (When did you become God, anyway?)

One of the challenges of living in community is that although most have been baptized, some don't seem to have heard "the good news" yet... or if they have, their smile has not been downloaded. The New Evangelization is for us to respond to the times and challenges we face with a fresh attitude willing to adapt to share the gospel (good news) in a way it can be received by people today. The New Evangelization also challenges us to "wake up" those Catholics who have gotten stuck in a joyless rut.

"Constipated Christians" have trapped themselves in their own way, their own truth and a sad life. Their path seems to have removed all peace, hope and joy... and they sound like the older brother griping and complaining to the Father in the field outside the celebration... the good news of the returning brother to life... of others getting involved and maybe not doing it the way they think it should be done. (This is not a question of evil being committed or someone being misled but things not corresponding with "my personal preferences.")

As a Vocation Director I know that when you bring anyone into a community, not only will the person change, but the community will change as well. It is no longer the same community even although you are called to live in the same spirit. New life brings with it transformation and change. (You have a baby in the house, everything changes.) We need to encourage and celebrate the opportunities for more people to be involved. Some are afraid of the uncertainty which occurs during times of growth and bringing others in. The church has had this struggle from the beginning when it opened the way to the gentiles. But this isn't something to fear, rather it is exciting to see the Holy Spirit alive in our parish community.

Last Sunday's reading from the Ephesians is incredibly important for us: "Do not grieve the Holy Spirit of God, with which you were sealed for the day of redemption. All bitterness, fury, anger, shouting, and reviling must be removed from you, along with all malice. And be kind to one another, compassionate, forgiving one another as God has forgiven you in Christ. So be imitators of God, as beloved

children, and live in love."

Rather than complaining and fault finding about "them" we are called to be one in Him, Jesus. So, if you hear someone complaining, encourage them to volunteer and get involved. Their involvement could lead them deeper into the New Evangelization. We sometimes forget that as church and individuals we are all under-construction. We are works in progress and that personal conversion is a continual and life-long project. When you read the lives of the saints you will quickly discover that they are incredibly aware of their need for growing in love. As long as I am alive in this world... God isn't done with me. Spend less time looking down your nose and others and more time lifting them up in prayer to God. Don't get stuck, try being cheerful and live the good news.

This summer our St. Jerome Children's Choir has shared their gift of music at our Saturday and Sunday night masses, the 11am mass and sung at two weddings. I am biased, but I know they are amazing! Our choir brings a fullness of life, joy and energy to the church. They have learned in the choir how to play guitar, ukulele, mandolin, banjo, bass and glockenspiel. We even have a violinist and saxophone player who have come to some of our practices. I want all of our young people to be welcomed, feel at home and have the opportunity to be involved in our parish. It is our Father's home and please don't impede children from coming closer to Jesus.

We have twelve new altar servers. I am grateful to their parents for making the time for their children to learn to assist at weddings, funerals and Sunday Liturgies. I am grateful for Letty and her husband, Al, setting aside their evenings to help train our kids in becoming altar servers. I want to recognize RANDY BILLUPS for his underappreciated years of service in training our altar servers. Like many who work in the background their efforts are easy to overlook. Randy has stepped down from this ministry early this summer. Thank you, Randy. I also want to acknowledge LAUREN HECHINGER who I understand began serving in 2009 as an elementary school student and is now hanging up her server's robe as she goes off to college. She has made clear that she is not retiring from the church and hopes to be a Eucharistic Minister in the near future.

I look forward to our newly confirmed and confirmation candidates who will be stepping up at our Sunday evening Youth Mass to serve God's people as Lectors, Eucharistic Ministers and Ministers of Hospitality. Please be patient as they grow into their vocation as fully initiated Catholics.

Don't be afraid of the new life of a crying infants, distracted toddlers or inquisitive children. Let them be your prayer as they are blessings and a sign of the Holy Spirit alive among us. "Let the children come to me and do not hinder them for to such as these belong the kingdom of God."
