His winnowing fan is in his hand to clear his threshing floor and to gather the wheat into his barn, but the chaff he will burn with unquenchable fire."

Johnny isn't the first to complement our parish on its hospitality and generosity. I credit our Adoration of The Blessed Sacrament which occurs each Monday through Saturday following daily mass until 3:15pm. People are praying for us, their families, the church and the world each day. There is power in the real presence of Jesus Christ in the Eucharist. We should be grateful for those who pray for us... and you are welcome to make time each day or week and join them.

The Craft-Faire was well attended and well received. I am grateful to all those who made this event a success again.

Fr. Uche's Anniversary Mass and celebration rated highly from the twenty guest priests as well as the Religious Sisters who attended. They were impressed by the love, hospitality and generosity they experienced. (We do know how to party right at St. Jerome.)

Our Adult Choir is bringing tears to my eyes with the beautiful music they are leading us in at mass. They give their time, talent and energy to share with us precious gifts of song.

Those who prepared our Senior Thanksgiving Box Dinner gave of their cooking skills and we who partook of this banquet are blessed by their generosity. Some home-bound have sent notes of gratitude. They see Jesus' word alive in action.

I had friends who visited Saint Jerome for adoration last Saturday afternoon. People were helpful and made them feel welcomed. Additionally, my friends were surprised at the number of activities we currently have as some Churches still seem to be in a cocoon stage... not yet having indoor masses nor regularly scheduled confessions.

Speaking of scheduled services, on **Tuesday, December 14th** we will have our annual **ADVENT ANOINTING OF THE SICK SERVICE**. It will begin at noon at our outdoor Adoration Chapel at the parking lot. The Anointing of the Sick is one of the seven sacraments. Additionally, the Anointing of the Sick brings with it the forgiveness of sins. Please note that people with contagious diseases are asked to call the rectory and arrange a private Anointing of the Sick.

According to Canon Law: To receive the Sacrament the person needs to be a baptized Catholic who has reached the age of reason, and has begun to be in danger from illness or the infirmities of age, or have become sick again or underwent a further crisis. It should be noted that the danger need only have begun to exist. The person does not have to be "in extremis" (in imminent danger of dying).

On **Friday, December 17th** at 7pm we will be celebrating our **SIMBANG GABI MASS**. Our Filipino Choir will be leading our sacred songs as we near Christmas. Food, of course, will be provided following mass.


On **Tuesday, December 21st** we will have our **ADVENT PENANCE SERVICE** beginning at 6pm. The church will be open with music in the background. Priests will be available at various stations within the church. The service will conclude at 7pm or when the lines for confessions have finished.


Seniors will have a **Christmas Box Dinner** opportunity: **Friday, December 24th** at noon. Call Juanita by December 17th to reserve your banquet.

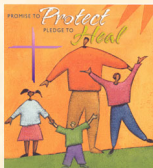

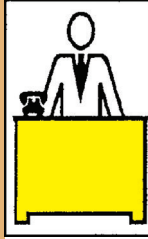
