

Rosary - following 8am daily Mass

From Fr. Bill

For some people baptism may seem a one-time ceremony involving cold water, oil and a candle or in Jesus' case a plunge into the Jordan River. Although these elements are accurate, for Catholics baptism isn't just something done to us, but someone... something we become: the baptized. We are baptized into Christ's body (the church) and have been chosen to continue the mission and ministry of Jesus Christ.

As Jesus is baptized by John the heavens open up, the Spirit descends in the form of a dove and a voice proclaims God's Fatherhood... "You are my beloved Son in whom I am well pleased." Jesus is named and claimed by God, the Father, as HIS Son. In Biblical times if a man named and claimed the child as his own... in the eyes of the community and the law... he is the father. At Jesus' baptism God the Father's paternity is revealed.

Water flowing, a new name and claimed by God as His child... through the Sacrament of Baptism we too are HIS children and as fully coheirs through the power of God in HIS naming and claiming us. This is why we Catholics believe once you are a Catholic, you are always a Catholic. The words announced at Jesus' baptism found in Mark should be tattooed on our heart and soul: "You are my beloved son (daughter). With you I am well pleased."

So, we have God, our Father. We have Jesus, our Savior and brother. We are called to be fully alive in their Holy Spirit with Mary, our Blessed Mother. Did I mention that each have a role in our family? We are Confirmed to continue the mission and ministry of our Savior and brother, Jesus Christ. What are you doing as your part in the Body of Christ? If someone watched us, what might they witness that might convince them that we are God's children? What service or ministry done in the Lord's name might they see as testimony that we are the Lord's?

Each time we share Eucharist, my "Amen" as I receive and become one with His Flesh and Blood... is my publicly renewed commitment to God's family and our part in the "family business" of being and sharing "the good news" of God's loving desire to be not only one of us but to be one with us. This isn't just the Pope's job... it is our VOCATION.

For a Catholic a vocation is what we "get to give" in order to be fully alive. A vocation is one's way of living life which is most loving... given the gifts, abilities and opportunities God has planted for us to develop and use for building up His Kingdom. (Yes, this is our role in the family business. No, Christians never "retire" or get out of the "family business.)

The most obvious Christian vocation is **Marriage**: becoming one with the Lord in order to be co-creators of life (children) God willing; to establish their own domestic church (a home where Christ is welcomed and present) where their children as well as guests can meet Jesus through this couple's friendship and love; and where the couple through friendship, respect and mutual love help each other in living their vocation and faith. Yet marriage is not just about turning toward our immediate family. How are WE helping build and support the Body of Christ outside our home? How do we model serving the Lord for our children?

Some are called to love their best through **Religious Life**: sisters, brothers, monks and nuns. They live in community, sharing all they have. They pray together, work with a common spirit and purpose... and commit their whole self to be of service to the church. Salesians, Sisters of St. Joseph of Carondelet, Daughters of Mary Congregation, and those guys over at LMU (Jesuits) are some of the Religious Communities of men and women which quickly come to my mind.

Some are called to the ordained ministries of **Holy Orders**: deacons, priests and bishops. The Holy Orders are focused on the Sacramental Life of the Church. These people are trained and chosen to be ordained for the service of a particular diocese. They promise obedience to the local bishop and promise to not get married again. (Yes, deacons can be married... but they were married first.) These men are called to be shepherds (willing to lay down their life for their sheep) working in collaboration with the local bishop in service of the people of God.

Some are called to **generous single life**. They share their time and talents often as teachers, doctors, nurses, counselors, childcare or a committed area of social justice. Their life is a sharing of their love through serving others by means of their God given talents. Their work brings them joy and rewards them with lives which are changed for the better because of their having journeyed with them. They are "good news" for the people they serve. For some this is a lifelong vocation. For others it may be transitional as God may open their hearts to something else.

A second "career" vocation is being **widow or widower**. This is similar to generous single life if one has no children or the children are grown; however, if they still have minor children (Single parents are in this category.) their ministry is being mom or dad. Their focus is doing what needs to be done to ensure their children have a loving home and the things of this world needed for their health and well-being.

God calls each of us to a vocation where we will be more happy, holy and able to bring our best to "our family" and be fully alive in His Spirit. Being baptized isn't just an event but is a way of life.



St. Jerome Bible Study will begin a study of the Gospel According to Mark via Zoom on **January 12**, from 7:30pm to 9pm. The study will run for 11 weeks on Tuesday evenings. The commentary and study guide can be purchased from Little Rock Scripture Study.

Mark is the shortest of the four gospels, Mark is the earliest account of Jesus' life. Mark asks everyone to answer Jesus' question, "Who do you say that I am?" and challenges believers in every generation to accept the reality of the cross.

National Day of Prayer

 January 22nd is the anniversary of the Supreme Court decisions legalizing abortion in the U.S. More than 59 million unborn boys and girls have died as a result of the 1973 Roe v. Wade and Doe v. Bolton Supreme Court decisions.

The USCCB has designated that date as a national "Day of Prayer for the Legal Protection of Unborn Children." Last year's Memorial Candle Service at the Cathedral of Our Lady of the Angels featured the lighting of 220 candles—one for each child surgically aborted on an average day in the Los Angeles Archdiocese. From the first letter of John

(1 Jn 5:1-9)

Beloved: Everyone who believes that Jesus is the Christ is begotten by God, and everyone who loves the Father loves also the one begotten by him. In this way we know that we love the children of God when we love God and obey his commandments. For the love of God is this, that we keep his commandments. And his commandments are not burdensome, for whoever is begotten by God conquers the world. And the victory that conquers the world is our faith. Who indeed is the victor over the world but the one who believes that Jesus is the Son of God?

This is the one who came through water and blood, Jesus Christ, not by water alone, but by water and blood. The Spirit is the one who testifies, and the Spirit is truth. Parking-Lot Etiquette Reminders

1. If you plan to park and move closer to the altar, please park your car further away so that others might be able to use your "nearer the altar parking spot" for mass. **The parking spots in front of the outside chapel marked with cones are only for vehicles that have a driver and/or passenger inside zooming the mass.**
2. Those leaving their cars to sit/stand outside in any of the property/parking lot area should park on the school side parking lot or at the Eastern side of the church lot closest to La Tijera. (This arrangement allows those who do not wish to leave their vehicles to attend mass AND helps the priest and ministers during communion and offertory since they spend time approaching vehicles only to discover there is no one in the car.)
3. It is not appropriate to try go from car to car seeking a seat. If we notice anyone going from vehicle to vehicle seeking admittance, they will be asked to leave as car-hoppers put both beggar and host at risk
4. Know that if you invite someone into your car, even when wearing masks, within less than 15 minutes you will be sharing both air and germs with each other.


