From Fr. Bill

The Anointing of the Sick is one of the seven sacraments. If you have cancer and receiving treatments, please let this sacrament be a part of your program. If you are going to have surgery which requires general anesthesia, please let the Anointing of the Sick be one step in your pre-op. If you struggle with a chronic condition, please consider including the Anointing of the Sick quarterly as a part of your pain regiment. If you need a cane or walker to move safely about, please include a quarterly Anointing of the Sick to help you stay focused. If you are struggling with depression or anxiety come to the Lord and receive His healing grace to assist in your struggles. If any of these describe you, come to our upcoming **Anointing of the Sick on Wednesday, March 31st at noon**. Additionally, the Anointing of the Sick brings with it the forgiveness of sins. Please note that people with contagious diseases are asked to call the rectory and arrange a private Anointing of the Sick.

According to Canon Law: To receive the Sacrament the person needs to be a baptized Catholic who has reached the age of reason, and has begun to be in danger from illness or the infirmities of age, or have become sick again or underwent a further crisis. It should be noted that the danger need only have begun to exist. The person does not have to be "in extremis" (in imminent danger of dying).

I encourage you to receive the sacrament when you are conscious and especially to receive the sacrament when your faith in God is being shaken because of an illness or health challenges.

I first received the Anointing of the Sick when I was twenty-eight and hospitalized for tests. I have been anointed two other times since. I have anointed a four year old with cancer and whose cancer has since gone into remission. (Trust me that at four years of age he had more wisdom and grace than many people I have encountered... but suffering can lead to that.) It is prudent and wise to take advantage of instruments of grace and healing.

"Be prepared" isn't just the Boy Scout motto... it is the way prudent Christians live... for no one knows the day nor the hour. If you are not in a state of grace... don't wait! Go to confession. **For Reconciliation please take advantage of our Saturday afternoon confessions on March 20th and 27th beginning at 1:30pm.** Confessions will continue until the line is done... but don't presume a line and be found foolish by arriving at 3pm and discovering that you missed your opportunity. Waiting in line prayerfully and patiently

would be a good Lenten sacrifice. **There are no scheduled confessions during Holy Week.** Please be prepared and don't wait until it is too late.

STATIONS OF THE CROSS: on our parish website www.stjeromelax.org/stations our St. Jerome School Youth will be posting a Stations of the Cross the week of Friday, March 19th. Our Youth Group will be posting a Stations of the Cross the week of Friday, March 26th. **On the evening of Friday, March 26th there will be a Stations of the Cross inside the Church at 5pm.** This service will be ZOOMED as well.

PALM SUNDAY is next weekend, March 28th. Yes, we will have palms to be blessed and distributed at all the Sunday's masses. Upon your arrival at St. Jerome you will be given your blessed palms. We will not be having a procession this year with our palm branches.

ADORATION OF THE BLESSED SACRAMENT will NOT be occurring on GOOD FRIDAY and HOLY SATURDAY. Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament will resume, as usual, on Easter Monday following the 8am Mass.

THE EASTER TRIDUUM: If you want to FULLY participate, **I recommend getting a Breaking Bread Book** to know the proper responses and to be able to participate in the Good Friday Passion.

HOLY THURSDAY: No morning mass today but we will have Eucharistic Adoration from 8am to 3:15pm.

THE MASS OF THE LORD'S SUPPER ON HOLY THURSDAY WILL BE AT 5PM IN THE CHURCH. Adoration will continue following this mass until 10pm in our outside chapel. (No foot washing)

GOOD FRIDAY: No Adoration today. The Stations of the Cross will be done outside at noon and will be ZOOMED as well. **THE LORD'S PASSION will be at 3pm at the outside chapel.** It will be ZOOMED. Communion will also be distributed following the reading of the Passion, the Good Friday formal intercessions and the Veneration of the Cross which will be a reverent "non-touch" bow or genuflection.

HOLY SATURDAY and THE EASTER VIGIL! No Adoration these days. **THE EASTER VIGIL will begin at 5pm at the outside chapel.** It will be ZOOMED. We do have adult candidates for Baptism, Confirmation and Eucharist.

EASTER SUNDAY! We will be having our normal Sunday Mass Schedule: 8am, 10am, noon and 5pm.

May God bless you and thank you for your prayers, patience and understanding.

Fast and Abstinence

As Friday was the day of Jesus' suffering and death, the Church asks Catholics to **abstain from eating meat on all the Fridays of Lent. ABSTINANCE** forbids the eating of meat for those who are over 14 years of age.

On GOOD FRIDAY we FAST. Fasting means eating no more than one full meal and 2 lighter meals for the day. No snacking is allowed, but fluid does not break the fast. Adults are bound to fast till beginning their 60th year.

We now have a regularly scheduled mass at noon on Sundays INSIDE the church. This mass will have the basic rules of masks, appropriate social distancing, and sanitizing before and after mass. Attendance will be limited so tickets are available seven days before the service at the rectory office or with Roxanne at her outdoor table.

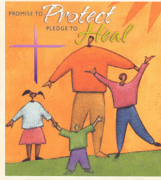
