Brothers and sisters: Live in love, as Christ loved us. Fr. Bill's Musings

A few people have been asking me, "When do we need to come back to church on Sundays?"

Ouch! Bad pastor! As a teacher I know I need to present material at least three times in different ways to make it more likely that the students retain the material. I also have learned that in a parish changes need to be announced over four to six weeks in order to ensure that most parishioners are aware of what is happening. I apologize for not having reminded you multiple times about the Precept of the Church regarding attendance at mass.

The Archbishop gave us about 15 months of not being required to attend mass to fulfill our Sunday and Holy Day Obligations. During this void we quickly established having our Sunday and weekday masses on Zoom. (My mother and sisters love seeing me preside and hearing me preach.) But this changed on Fathers Day this last June.

In Archbishop Jose Gomez' words: "On June 19th and 20th, I encourage the Catholic faithful of the Archdiocese of Los Angeles to return to in-person Sunday Mass and the celebration of the Sacraments, especially for those who are in good health. By this letter, effective June 19, 2021, the dispensation from the obligation to attend Sunday Mass and Holy Days of Obligation in response to the coronavirus pandemic will be lifted for the Catholic faithful of the Archdiocese of Los Angeles. **Those who have serious and legitimate reasons** (e.g., illness, underlying health conditions that renders them susceptible to illness, significant fears of becoming ill, etc.,) are **dispensed from the obligation to attend Sunday Mass and Holy Days of Obligation.**"

Basically, if you are going to work/school, dining in restaurants, going to stores and going to parties or baseball games... you have no excuse for not fully participating (ATTENDING) Sunday and Holy Day Services.

HOWEVER, those who have legitimate reasons of health are DISPENSED (They are not required to attend the mass.) from the obligation.

Please note that Zoom NEVER fulfilled the obligation. Zooming services are a good way to stay connected with our parish community and to be fed spiritually, yet, to fulfill the obligation you need to have the opportunity to receive the Eucharist at that service. This is only possible for those who have assembled together. For those dispensed this is not an issue. For those in good health, but choose to remain separated from receiving the Eucharist... if you freely, consciously and knowingly excuse yourself from attending the Lord's Banquet **without a good reason...** you are rejecting His invitation. This is matter for confession.

Our St. Jerome masses will continue to be zoomed on weekdays and Sunday mornings at 8am and 10am. I know people who watch and listen at home, in their car and at work.

With the return of our children to school, our Friday morning masses will be held in church. The mass will be zoomed as well with communion available for those participating and present. Following mass, the outdoor altar will be set up for adoration which will begin by 9am at our outdoor chapel. Adoration will conclude at 3:15 as usual.

When do we need to come back to church on Sundays? If you are in good health, the Body of Christ is waiting for your real presence at mass.
