## From Fr. Bill

I cry at graduations. I know it is selfish, but I miss our St. Jerome's Class of 2021. Up until last March, I ONLY saw them four or five days per week. I was with many of them three to five hours a week in class, choir and in church... for four years. Then covid... the age of zoom, separation and distance.

I can hear their voices and instruments in my mind and regret that this year their time to shine as musicians and choir was a covid casualty. Yet, as I watch them fly off I know they will do well. Their families love them. God loves them. And if you don't know, I love them.

I know they all got accepted to the high schools to which they applied. I know they have amazing gifts and that God has plans for them beyond what we can imagine. I know that many of them will be in our LIFEteen and confirmation programs in the fall. I know our seventh graders are ready to set up and accept the challenge of their departure. I guess it is my version of an "empty nest." But God not only has plans for them, but for us... so we move forward, following Him... trusting Him.

Trusting God doesn't mean I don't cry, as my every tear is a memory which becomes the stained glass of my soul where the light of God has shown me His presence. "For you I work. For you I pray. For you I study." If shepherds don't love their sheep, they aren't really shepherds. Pray that our young people hear the call God has for them as we need good shepherds: priests, deacons and men and women in religious life.

The church is always under Construction... and after the "pause" of covid we need to renew our efforts in building the Body of Christ... both as individuals and church!

When we pray the creed we profess: "I believe in one, holy, catholic and apostolic Church." Don't deceive yourself about these marks of the Church... this is not a description of what is... but the target of what we are called to be. Additionally, as we are Church, these are marks that should direct our choices, words and actions.

One: We are baptized into the Body of Christ. We are invited into the relationship of love that is the Holy Trinity (one God - three persons - Father, Son and Holy Spirit). We are challenged to live as "One in the Lord." Praying together testifies to this relationship. Supporting, encouraging and forgiving each other strengthen these bonds of unity. Humility (remembering we are but dust and that all God has made me is gift to be shared) and obedience (listening for God's will especially through Christ's Vicar on earth, the successor of Peter, the Pope; Church teachings and the Holy Scriptures) are essential aspects of this mark of the Church. Selfish-

ness, sin and pride attack this unity we are graced to become.

Holy: We belong to Christ. We are chosen and called to live as His people. We are gifted with the means of receiving and being instruments of His grace and His love. We are temples of His Holy Spirit able to carry within our person, His presence. We are called to see as Christ sees and act as Jesus would want. Loving God, and loving our neighbor as we love ourselves testify to holiness. Holiness is a way of living in the "now" aware of God with us.

Catholic: All are welcomed. It doesn't matter where you are from, what you have done, the language you speak, your occupation, your orientation, gender or age... what matters is that Jesus loves you... wants to heal you... wants to be with you now and for all eternity. As His arms stretch out to the world on the cross... we are called to reach out and recognize that they are my family... my brother... my sister. Tension we may feel is the Holy Spirit challenging us to more and better because love is not static but transforming. We surrender and enter into a love so great that He was willing to die for us.

Apostolic: We are sent. We have a mission... to continue the mission and ministry of Jesus Christ. God made each of us for a reason... on purpose... for His purpose. We are a Church under construction... witnessing, inviting, defending... giving hope to the hopeless and sent to bring light to those darkness. We are Confirmed as His disciples and anointed to share our gifts to transform the world and help make the Kingdom of God more visible and able to be shared in the love we live.

Don't get too comfortable. Jesus has things that only you can do. Be one, holy, catholic and apostolic.

On the last Sunday of June we will be celebrating the Feast of Our Lady of Perpetual Help. This devotion has been a blessing to me and given me support, encouragement and hope during this last year when so many things seemed to be taken away for our protection. I know that I need Jesus and Mary for dealing with adversity and they have lead me through with joy, hope and love.

You are invited to join the Nine Day Our Lady of Perpetual Help Novena beginning on Saturday evening, June 19th at 6pm. You are welcome to Zoom it, do it on your own or join us in church for this half-hour of prayer. The Novena will conclude on Sunday, June 27th with a Rosary Procession led with the image of Our Blessed Mother prior to the noon mass in church.

I will have more details for you next week. Let us continue to uplift one-another in prayer!

(Heb 9:11-15)

Brothers and sisters: When Christ came as high priest of the good things that have come to be, passing through the greater and more perfect tabernacle not made by hands, that is, not belonging to this creation, he entered once for all into the sanctuary, not with the blood of goats and calves but with his own blood, thus obtaining eternal redemption.
