First Sunday of Lent Liturgy of the Word

From the book of Genesis

(Gn 2:7-9; 3:1-7)

The LORD God formed man out of the clay of the ground and blew into his nostrils the breath of life, and so man became a living being.

Then the LORD God planted a garden in Eden, in the east, and placed there the man whom he had formed. Out of the ground the LORD God made various trees grow that were delightful to look at and good for food, with the tree of life in the middle of the garden and the tree of the knowledge of good and evil.

Now the serpent was the most cunning of all the animals that the LORD God had made. The serpent asked the woman, "Did God really tell you not to eat from any of the trees in the garden?" The woman answered the serpent: "We may eat of the fruit of the trees in the garden; it is only about the fruit of the tree in the middle of the garden that God said, 'You shall not eat it or even touch it, lest you die." But the serpent said to the woman: "You certainly will not die! Lent can be viewed as an opportunity to focus on mathematical operations: addition, subtraction, multiplication, division.

Lent is a time to add something good. What am I adding for Lent? Perhaps reading scripture each day? How about a daily examine of conscience? On Friday doing the Stations of the Cross? Perhaps walking outside and enjoying God's creation daily or weekly? Join the Our Mother of Perpetual Help Novena Mass this Wednesday at 5:30pm? Friday Evening Prayer Group? Joining to pray the rosary following a weekday morning mass? Beginning March 4th, I am adding coffee and donuts in the hall on the Sundays of Lent following the 8am and 10am masses for community building. Of course, you are encouraged to come.

Lent is a time to subtract something I like. What am I giving up for Lent? You might want to give up Social Media as studies suggest that "virtual living" rather than time spent with friends have contributed to record high rates of depression and self-harm. How about giving up meat for Lent? I am, other than mass and St. Patrick's day, giving up alcohol.

Lent is a time to multiply and divide. It is a time to place something in the Lord's hands to be blessed and shared. How about Operation Rice Bowl? One can, yes we can? Earthquake relief? Why not give up Starbucks and donate those monies to charity?


