Rosary - following 8am daily Mass

From Fr. Bill

We had our annual priests meeting with the Archbishop. Usually held at the Cathedral, this year it was online... as too many things seem to be. Our eight new priests were introduced. Our priests who died this year were remembered and prayed for. The Archbishop thanked the priests who have been creative and able to continue to be good shepherds giving prayerful and sacramental opportunities for the faithful. He also expressed financial concerns for catholic schools and parishes. With our buildings closed and services restricted attendance and participation is likely to remain lower than usual. The Archbishop is grateful for those Catholics who have continued to support the church in these difficult times and specifically noted those who are helping Catholic children get the type of education they deserve and need.

The Archbishop expressed the desire for churches and schools to be "safely" opened in the near future. (He did not give any expectation regarding a date.) Covid should be kept in mind, but people's mental health, social needs and the damage being inflicted upon school aged children (depression, anxiety, suicide, weight gain) needs to be included in decision making. Contacting people in positions of leadership in the city and county of Los Angeles regarding opening schools was specifically mentioned.

The keynote talk was excellent, but I will be speaking about that next weekend. I pass on to you a prayer we used that I had not encountered before: St. Therese's Prayer for Priests.

O Jesus, I pray for your faithful and fervent priests; for your unfaithful and tepid priests; for your priests laboring at home or abroad in distant mission fields; for your tempted priests; for your lonely and desolate priests; for your young priests; for your dying priests; for the souls of your priests in Purgatory.

But above all, I recommend to you the priests dearest to me: the priest who baptized me; the priests who've absolved me from my sins; the priests at whose Masses I've assisted and who've given me Your Body and Blood in Holy Communion; the priests who've taught and instructed me; all the priests to whom I am indebted in any other way, especially (name).

O Jesus, keep them all close to your heart, and bless them abundantly in time and in eternity. Amen.

The Archangels (Rafael, Gabriel and Michael) were honored on September 29th. They are great agents to have in your life. St. Rafael (God heals) is a great patron when facing surgery, working with the sick and especially when dealing with a difficult or uncooperative people. St. Gabriel (God is my strength) is a great helper when going through difficult times and assists us in trusting that God will bring us through.

St. Michael (Who is like God?) is an essential ally in keeping God first in our life. The devil loves to distract, mislead, or trip up those seeking to follow the Lord. St. Michael helps us to remember who we are and how much we truly need to be with God. Those in authority especially need his assistance as power tends to blind us as by our nature we tend to allow our desires to over-rule God's will.

October is RESPECT LIFE MONTH and also the month of the Holy Rosary. God knows America needs prayer. From womb to the tomb we are to support God's gift of Life.

Next Saturday, October 10th immediately following the 8am mass and beginning of adoration we will begin praying for ourselves, our country and the world. I spent all those years praying the Rosary for the conversion of Russia and China and world peace. Too bad that I presumed America did not need conversion which is now so blatantly obvious. We need Jesus so much and our Blessed Mother is a great role model and guide to her Son, "Do whatever He tells you to do." The Rosary and Litany of Our Blessed Mother will be a part of our program of prayer which should be finishing around 10am. You need not be Catholic to attend. Let us unite in prayer for our country which so much needs Christ's peace and healing.

By the way, at our September Parish Finance Council Meeting one of our members suggested that I remind people that 100% of all monies donated to the SCHOOL FUND, the BUILDING FUND and the CHURCH ENHANCEMENT FUND remain here at St. Jerome's.... while general donations and the basket get 10% taken by the archdiocese for its operations. Another member reminded me of a previous pastor who got in trouble for all of the donations suddenly shifting to the BUILDING FUND. I AM NOT SUGGESTING THIS as we need general donations for salaries, insurance, utilities, and others things needed to continue operations BUT please each month do use your yellow school envelop and the building fund envelop (or the online equivalent). Thank you for your ongoing support.

Thank You! We now have nine children receiving assistance with tuition for their St. Jerome School education. Thank you parishioners who have stepped up to help these little ones. However, we have a few more to go! We still have 2 children in need of \$150 per month (\$1,500 for the year) and 10 children in need of \$100 per month (\$1,000 for the year). Please help our children and their families who do sacrifice much to give ~~their children~~ **OUR CHILDREN** the education they need and deserve. Thank you for prayerfully considering this helping our children. They are our children and our future. Please help them get the Catholic education these children truly need and deserve. Thank you.
