From Fr. Bill

Holy Week was amazing!

The number of confessions prior weekends suggested it would be. The many people who came for the communal Anointing of the Sick, close to two hundred, helped prepare this Lenten Journey for its conclusion. Those who worked into the twilight to complete our outdoor Stations of the Cross upgrade in time for Good Friday gave us a beautiful and wonderful blessing. Even Ivan Houston who graduated from this world last March gave a donation of seventy thousand dollars to St. Jerome's. (I didn't see that coming, but am truly grateful for his spirit of generosity toward our church and school which were so much a part of his life.) Our God does amazing this for us and indeed we are glad.

Holy Thursday in the church was beautiful. As we are forbidden to sing, it must have been the angels which brought to my ear both two and three-part harmony in some of the hymns and service music. The sacred song not only filled the church, but more importantly filled our hearts along with the real presence of the Eucharist. More than one person commented to me the next day that they couldn't get Pange, Lingua, Gloriosi out of their mind. I must admit that this hymn, which is more commonly sung at benediction (Tantum Ergo), happens to be a hymn that frequently fills my heart following communion.

Our noon, Good Friday, Stations of the Cross was beautiful. Close to one hundred of us made the journey together. The children taking turns to carry the cross was especially moving. Again I am grateful to those who upgraded the stations from those plastic cards we pinned to the fourteen stations last lent, to metal plates which should hold their color for at least three years.

The Lord's Passion at 3pm was powerful. I am grateful to all who gave of their talents and time to reveal and magnify the love and mercy of our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ. The proclamation of the Passion was well done. The music allowed us all to, as St. Augustine says, double the power of our prayer (like praying twice). The Veneration of the Cross was done with deep devotion. And the reception of communion was done with respect, reverence and love.

The Easter Vigil was a memorable adventure. Given the persistent strong winds of the evening, I consider it was a minor miracle that we were able to get the Easter Candle lit. I was even more surprised that it continued to burn brightly throughout the entire evenings service. Our three candidates were more radiant than the candles following their Baptism, Confirmation and First Com-

munion. They, their sponsors and their families were excited and happy to be involved in this life evolving evening.

Easter Sunday morning I had a headache and felt as though I was a grouch. I did take an advil, offered it up to the Lord and pleaded with Him to get my head, heart and spirit in the right place for ministering to His people. By the gospel the Lord had my spirit in a good place: fully conscious of His love and the many blessings He has done for us.

After mass, as I was waving goodbye to our Saint Jerome Parishioners and wishing them a happy Easter, a woman hurried up to me and asked what I felt during the homily. I wasn't sure how to answer but I felt blessed. She spoke about a glow of light and a rainbow of colors that I seemed to be bathed in as I preached. I didn't notice that, but a couple of other people mentioned that they witnessed it. When I joined my mother for Easter dinner, she told me she had seen it as well. I must say that light and colors are nice but what matters is hearts and lives receiving our Lord and being transformed. If I helped people come closer to our Lord, I am being the servant I was ordained to be.

Sunday afternoon I encountered someone who I hadn't seen in over a year. She asked, "When the church would be opened for services?"

I wanted to tell her that the church never closed. Doors might be blocked with a stone, but as long as two or three gather together, the Body of Christ continues to pray, worship and serve... and we did.

By the way, she didn't realize that we have been having Sunday Mass at noon in the church since the beginning of Lent and as of Easter now also have the Sunday evening 5pm Mass in church.

As our church is large and well-ventilated, we won't be using tickets for the time being as we can comfortably and safely have six-hundred attend services. (Our capacity is over 1200 which I have only seen on Ash Wednesday and Easter mornings.) So we should be fine for the time being.

P.S. I have finished my two rounds of covid vaccine as most of the staff as St. Jerome's has also done. I encourage you to get the vaccine, if you are able. I look forward to being able to see all of your bright shiny faces. Happy Easter!

Then he said to Thomas, "Put your finger here and see my hands, and bring your hand and put it into my side, and do not be unbelieving, but believe." Thomas answered and said to him, "My Lord and my God!" Jesus said to him, "Have you come to believe because you have seen me? Blessed are those who have not seen and have believed."

Now Jesus did many other signs in the presence of his disciples that are not written in this book. But these are written that you may come to believe that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of God, and that through this belief you may have life in his name.

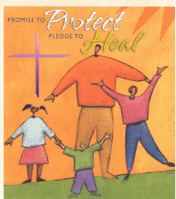
