I would like to thank everyone who helped us to have a wonderful carnival last weekend. I had a blast at Bingo. The food, music, games, and rides helped us build friendship and fun. I hope you and your family enjoyed being with us.

Next weekend we have another opportunity to have fun and build community: The Craft Faire. Good food seems to be a sign of a St. Jerome event. Expect that as well as creative talents revealed to help do some Christmas shopping or gifts for one's self.

Some points of consensus I have come across from the recent synod: (1) Formation is needed in "authentic" discipleship, united by the Eucharist and nourished by the Word (At this time "authentic" seems to be an eye of the beholder thing.); (2) The church needs to discern how people at all levels are called to do their mission; (3) The church needs to reflect on what formation priests, deacons and laity need to carry out their mission together; (4) The Catholic Church needs stronger collaboration between the Eastern Churches and the Latin Church; (5) The church needs to evangelize digital spaces intentionally as a part of its mission; (6) Sexual abuse undermines the church's mission. (Yes, sin and unfaithfulness do.)

Mass Intentions

Arranging to have Mass offered for a departed loved one, for someone sick, celebrating a Birthday, an Anniversary or some other special intention is a long-standing tradition for Catholics.

The church has the custom of each mass being sponsored by someone in honor of someone. This person's donation for that mass is meant to reduce or cover the expenses for that particular service: bread, wine, candles, electricity and other essential elements. (A mass may only be sponsored by one person, but they may pray for two or three different people.)

The person sponsoring the mass does receive a card with the date and time of the mass they are sponsoring and the intention they have requested to be remembered and prayed for in a special way that day. The mass intention is general publicly prayed for during the intercessions following the homily.

On December 1, 2023 we will begin booking masses for 2024. You can mail the request for a Mass intention along with the stipend to the Rectory office. You can phone a request during business hours with the parish secretary, who's also available at the 8am & 10am Sunday masses outside in the parking lot.

It is customary to offer a Mass stipend or donation for each mass arranged. The suggested stipend for a weekday Mass is \$15 and \$25 for a Sunday Mass. You are welcome to donate more.



SAFEGUARD THE CHILDREN

What are the rules about minors serving as volunteers? It is the job of adults to protect

children from harm and abuse. However, many minors are also volunteers at school and at church, which sometimes makes it difficult to know what roles minors should play. Within programs or ministries, there should always be an adult in an official supervisory role. Minors should be helping, but never directly in charge of younger children. Meeting this standard can be challenging but it is important in keeping all children, including minor volunteers, safe.
