NICENE CREED

My name is Fr. Bill Bolton and I am the pastor of St. Jerome. During my years at St. Jerome's I have been privileged to meet many wonderful people. I will mention the three living original parishioners still connected with St. Jerome: Rosemary Becker, Louise Meehan and Steve Hoffman. (Louise called to let us know she won't be able to attend but will continue to keep us in her prayers.) They have lived the history from the early days of mass at a nearby theater and our church property being a "breakfast ranch" (producing ham and eggs), through the abundant growth of the 1950's and 60's, through the softball field on the corner becoming what is now our St. Jerome Church.

An area that was once dominated by farms, then houses, seems quickly to be transforming into apartments and multi-story dwellings. We have people from every race and many languages from Africa, Asia, Europe, Australia, North and South America. The many changes are voiced in stories some of our seasoned parishioners have shared. United and centered on Christ, we too have stories to share... the gospel of the life we live each day.

I have appreciated the sense of welcoming and home I've found here at St. Jerome. People seem glad to see each other and whether Bruin or Trojan, saint or sinner, visitor to LA or those who think of St. Jerome's as their family: all are welcome. Whether we are celebrating Simbang Gabi in preparation for Christmas, singing with our African and Fil-Am Choirs, doing the Second Line Dance at Madri Gras, rejoicing at our New Years Party, feeding friends at our monthly soup kitchen, getting ready for the Craft-Faire or Carnival, visiting the homebound or those imprisoned, our doors and hearts are open to those God brings us to.

Thank you to all who have given us so many blessings through prayers, works and sacrifices to make St. Jerome's what it is today. Yet remember, Jesus isn't finished with us. Catholics don't retire. Our ministry and service may change but our mission as disciples continues as long as we have breath. Even in heaven we pray and intercede for those in the world. I pray that as His Body we will welcome the opportunities to help make Christ's Kingdom more present to those we meet.

History of St. Jerome Church

1949: St. Jerome Parish was established on May 6, 1949 with the appointment of Father Thomas McNicholas as pastor. About 300 families attended Mass in the La Tijera Theater while ground-breaking for the Church and auditorium took place on December 27, 1949.

1950: First Mass in the new St. Jerome Church was celebrated on October 22, 1950. The Rectory (present convent) was completed about the same time.

1965-1966: Construction of a new Church designed by architect Raymond Whalley, a St. Jerome parishioner, began October, 1965 and was finished shortly after the death of Monsignor McNicholas in a freak car accident on Thanksgiving Day, November 26, 1966.

1967-1972: Father Michal Walsh became pastor on January 25, 1967 and established a regular schedule of masses in the new Church on May 14th. He served as pastor until September, 1972.

1951: The Church was dedicated by Most Reverend Timothy Manning on April 8, 1951 and First Communion celebrated as well.

1952: Ground broken for first school building on March 28, 1952 and students moved in October 27th. The other two buildings were completed in 1957 and 1961. Dedication to the school, under the direction of the Sisters of St. Joseph of Carondelet, took place on May 15, 1958.

1973-1987: When Father Michael Haran was unable to assume his pastorate due to illness and eventual death, Father Edmund Maechler was appointed pastor of St. Jerome by Cardinal Timothy Manning in March, 1973. He spent the years improving St. Jerome by building steps to connect the new Church to the streets and parking lot, but establishing a Senior Center and gym where the old church had been, and by beginning the Legion of Mary, School Support Organization, Marriage Encounter and by adding kindergarten to the school program. Father Maechler retired due to illness on October 4, 1987 and continues to be dearly loved by parishioners of St. Jerome.

1977: Leadership and generosity results in the Church debt being paid off, and Cardinal Timothy Manning comes again to St. Jerome to dedicate the beautiful new Church on January 16, 1977.

1988-2002: Pastor James Kavanagh was appointed pastor by Archbishop Roger Mahoney on April 23, 1988 and served during the 40th and 50th St. Jerome parish anniversary celebrations. He had the stained glass windows behind the altar and above the exterior doors designed and installed and oversaw a six-month renovation of the Church following the January 17, 1994 Northridge earthquake.

Today our "first" church is now the Parish Hall

During this time Masses were celebrated in the Parish Hall which brought parishioners much closer both physically and spiritually. Father Jim became pastor of St. James, Redondo Beach, and for several years had sponsored an annual Hollywood Bowl night with St. James and St. Jerome parishioners. 2002-2003: Father Paul Wolkovitz succeeded Father Kavanagh and served as pastor of St. Jerome beginning July 1, 2002.

2003-2015: Appointment of Monsignor Norman Priebe as pastor took place in July 2003, and he was instrumental in encouraging parishioners to implement the directives of the Archdiocesan Synod at St. Jerome. Parish planning led to a capital campaign (Preserving our Past, Building Our Future) to refurbish and renovate the parish hall and gymnasium and parish grounds as part of the 60th Anniversary of St. Jerome Parish. Bishop Edward Clark presided over the 60th Anniversary Mass on September 29, 2009.

2015-present: Upon Msgr. Norm's retirement in 2015, Fr. Wilbur "Bill" F. Bolton, S.D.B. was assigned to our parish as administrator. He had just completed a 5-year term as Associate Pastor of Sacred Heart Church (Ventura). Fr. Bill was then a member of the Salesians of Don Bosco and was ordained a priest in 1987. On August 16, 2016, he was accepted by Archbishop Jose Gomez as a member of the Presbyterate of the Catholic Church of Los Angeles. Fr. Bill was officially installed as Pastor of St. Jerome on July 9, 2017 at a Mass celebrated by Bishop Edward Clark.
