December 24th at 5pm we will have our Christmas Vigil Mass. At 9pm we will have our Mass at Mid-night.

December 25th, Christmas Day, we will have Mass at 8am, 10am and noon. We will not be having an evening mass on Christmas Day.

On December 30th we will be having our End of the Year Dinner and Dance. Sunday, December 31st have our usual Sunday Schedule.

BEING and BECOMING CATHOLIC

Our next St. Jerome RCIA class on the Catholic Faith **has re-zoomed on Thursdays at 7pm.**



Anyone who is thinking about being baptized Catholic, anyone who needs to make their Confirmation, and anyone who would like a *refresher* on what the Church teaches, please join us! If you have not already enrolled, please call the Rectory and leave your name and email address. We will send you the zoom information.

Mass Intentions: Arranging to have Mass offered for a departed loved one, for someone sick, celebrating a Birthday, an Anniversary or some other special intention is a long-standing tradition for Catholics.

The church has the custom of each mass being sponsored by someone in honor of someone. This person's donation for that mass is meant to reduce or cover the expenses for that particular service: bread, wine, candles, electricity and other essential elements. (A mass may only be sponsored by one person, but they may pray for two or three different people.)

The person sponsoring the mass does receive a card with the date and time of the mass they are sponsoring and the intention they have requested to be remembered and prayed for in a special way that day. The mass intention is general publicly prayed for during the intercessions following the homily.

On December 1, 2023 we will begin booking masses for 2024. You can mail the request for a Mass intention along with the stipend to the Rectory office. You can phone a request during business hours with the parish secretary, who's also available at the 8am & 10am Sunday masses outside in the parking lot.

It is customary to offer a Mass stipend or donation for each mass arranged. The suggested stipend for a weekday Mass is \$15 and \$25 for a Sunday Mass. You are welcome to donate more.
