I will be meeting with our "Called To Renew" Construction Program Manager supplied by the Archdiocese. His input is required for any CTR Project over 50 thousand dollars. To date, we have completed replacing the church's front doors. Our outside lighting project is on deck. He has mentioned he can recommend companies for our church pew and kneeler project. Thank you for helping make these projects possible with your Called To Renew Support.

In July, our perimeter fencing is going to be repaired. One location was damaged by a falling tree. The other location, which still had our old fencing near the ATT Tower, was damaged by someone cutting a pathway into our adjoined Honda Dealer's parking lot. This section of fencing will be upgraded to lessen temptation.

Looking forward to our 75th, this summer, our church exterior and planters will be getting repainted. Also, our Parish Hall interior will be getting painted and receive new base-boards. Speaking of the hall, we are continuing try to get our hall and gym lights functional at the wall light-switches. Our Parish Hall electrical is a computer controlled system with CAT-5 wiring connecting switches to the computer panel and then to the lights. Our warrantee is up and the company responsible, after various attempts, and replacing of parts, has been unable to keep it working for more than a few hours. If you know someone who might be able to resurrect our system, let me know.

In July the four Catholic High Schools who use our church parking lot as a school bus stop will be helping pay for a concrete-bus stop slab to minimize further damage to our asphalt. Our lot was never intended for parking heavy vehicles and busses.

When I first arrived at St. Jerome in 2016 I was impressed by the number of reasonably priced apartments in our parish. There were a number of apartments in easy walking distance of the church available for just over \$1000 per month. The places were nice. They shared our wonderful sunlight and afternoon breeze.

In 2018 I encountered long time residents who were being evicted to make room for "affordable housing." The goal seems to be getting rid of people needing to live in reasonably priced housing to make space for a "better class" of people. These new apartments buildings which replaced them were taller (3 or 5 stories high) and seem to be built with insufficient parking for their residents. Good luck finding any apartment in these new complexes under \$2000.

I question if these projects are for the benefit of the people living in the area or more for the builders and corporations profiting from these projects. Build it and they will come? Perhaps they will, but the signs on most apartment complexes in our area testify "For Rent."

Homeless crisis? According to CBS on April 9, 2024, "California has spent \$24 billion to tackle homelessness over the past five years." In this same time the number of homeless has increased. The homeless are still sleeping in their filth and stumbling out into traffic. The root cause is the drug addiction and mental health crisis we have in California. Until these issues are addressed, evicting the poorer among us to build "so called" affordable housing will not impact the mentally ill and addicted continuing to live on the streets.

I share the following letter that might be of interest to you regarding a part of St. Jerome Parish:

Dear Neighbors' -

We are all stakeholders in both the City and County Westside Community Plans. The County released their Environmental Impact for its Westside Area Plan yes-


terday. They are giving the public 45 days to comment on their Plan to UPZONE seven commercial/retail sites, church property, and all of the multi-family dwellings on Fairview and Springpark by the Ladera Center into zoning for mixed-use (commercial/residential 6-8 story high rise buildings. Please note the podcast says this zoning reclassification is to allow "Affordable" housing to be built in Ladera Heights. DO NOT BE FOOLED!!, The zoning proposal does not have any requirement for a single low-income or ultra low-income (for the unhoused) units. Also, if they designate a few as 5% of the new units as "affordable" the State allows them to added additional stories on the buildings up to 9 stories. If you read the County and City Plans (available on the LaderaMatters.com website). THE GOAL IS GENTRIFICATION. There would be more housing in the proposed high-rises, but they will not be for the unhoused or low-income tenants. LET'S STOP USING THE WORD "AFFORDABLE." It is a relative term. Instead be specific an refer to low-, ultra-low, or moderate income units compared to market-rate/luxury apartment rates.

DO NOT BE FOOLED! The City and County Plans are not about adding what we would define as "affordable" housing units. Both Plans propose to upzone parcels with rent-controlled rental units for moderate-income families. The residents in all of the existing moderately priced apartment, condos, duplexes or triplexes would be displaced. THE COST OF A DESIGNATED "AFFORDABLE" 1-BEDROOM UNIT IN THE HOWARD HUGHES REGIONAL CENTER JUST DOWN THE STREET, IS \$3500 PER MONTH AND THERE IS A MINIMUM INCOME REQUIREMENT OF \$120,000 PER YEAR. This will not solve the Affordable Housing Crisis!

Educate your friends, neighbors and family members to submit comments to the EIR and LA City Planners.

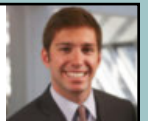
