Our visiting priest this weekend is Father Gary Wiesmann. HE WILL BE PREACHING AT ALL THE MASSES TODAY. He is a priest of the Diocese of Mandeville, Jamaica. Ordained to priesthood for the Archdiocese of Miami in 1983, he has a Master of Divinity degree from Mount Saint Mary Seminary in Cincinnati, Ohio and a Master of Social Work degree from Barry University in Miami, Florida. After serving three years in parish ministry, Father Gary spent the next 13 years in special ministries: Archdiocesan Director of Vocations; Director of Catholic Charities programs and priest-secretary for Archbishop Edward McCarthy and Bishop Norbert Dorsey, C.P.

Over the next few years, Father Gary completed a six-month sabbatical at the Jesuit School of Theology in Berkeley, California after which he served in parish ministry, hospital ministry and began preaching on behalf of the poor at the invitation of the bishop of Mandeville, Jamaica. During this time, and with a deeper commitment to the poorest of the poor, Fr. Gary incardinated into the Diocese of Mandeville and serves as Director of Mission Awareness. Father Gary preaches mission appeals throughout the United States doing fundraising for the diocese of Mandeville.

WE THANK YOU for considering to support The Diocese of Mandeville Mission Cooperation Program.

EVANGELIZATION: Catechetical Programs for adults, adolescents and children is a primary goal of the Diocese. Our diocesan director of Evangelization needs to provide on-going theological updating for catechists for each of our 18 parishes and 3 missions. <u>Approximately 40% of our people are illiterate</u>. As our people come to know Our Lord more personally and are more formally educated in the faith, our ability to evangelize will be enhanced and our diocese will continue to grow. From our parishes and missions, Sunday collections cover about 10% of the cost to operate these parishes.

HELPING THE POOR: We provide the basics: food, clothing and housing for poor people throughout our diocese. Thousands of families in our diocese live in rubble-like shacks made of boards/tin/cardboard/palm fawns without running water, electricity or bathrooms. Each year thousands lose their shacks and what little they possess due to the tropical weather and storms.

YOUTH HOMES/WORK TRAINING: We provide a program for abused, neglected, orphaned youth and youth who need a chance to learn a trade to support themselves in life. We care for their medical needs and educating them so they can get a job and break the cycle of poverty.

CATHOLIC SCHOOLS: Our catholic religion is taught along with the skills and courses our youth so desperately need to survive as adults. We also provide breakfast/lunch for children who come to school with no food. We hope to provide <u>scholarships to catholic adults</u> so they can be educated to teach in our Catholic Schools.

YOUTH MINISTRY: Our Diocesan Youth Director creates programs in parishes to welcome youth and to provide an environment for youth to know the Lord. Funding is needed to "grow" this program and provide an environment for our youth to grow in the Catholic faith and learn Catholic morals.

CARE FOR THE SICK: The diocese operates clinics which provide basic health care. These clinics also assist our people who suffer from HIV/AIDS and other terminal illnesses. <u>Our diocese is large in area and we need to expand this pastoral/medical outreach to out-lying areas</u>. More clinics are needed to respond to health issues brought to us by our people since most will never see a health care professional except at one of our clinics and we need help for our AIDS ministry.

HOME FOR THE ELDERLY: Our "Home for Destitute Elderly" houses 75 seniors many of whom are sick and have been abandoned by their families. We rely upon contributions to bring this dignity and a home to our destitute elderly.



I believe that God brings people into my life for a reason. I am blessed and grateful for having John and Juanita as well as their family in my life. I do miss seeing them every day. I do believe that the love of Christ will some day bring us all together again in a place much better than in LA or Georgia.
