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

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Mass Intentions

Arranging to have Mass offered for a departed loved one, for someone sick, celebrating a birthday, an anniversary or some other special intention is a long-standing Catholic tradition.

The church has the custom of each mass being sponsored by someone in honor of someone. This person's donation for that mass is meant to reduce or cover the expenses for that particular service: bread, wine, candles, electricity and other essential elements.

A particular mass may only be sponsored by one person, but they may pray for two or three different people or a special intention.

The person sponsoring the mass does receive a card with the date and time of the mass they are sponsoring and the intention they have requested to be remembered and prayed for in a special way that day. The mass intention is usually publicly prayed for during the intercessions which follow the homily.

On Sunday, December 1, 2024 we will begin booking masses for 2025. You can mail the request for a Mass intention along with the stipend to the Rectory office. You can phone a request during business hours with the parish secretary, who's also available at the 8am & 10am Sunday masses outside in the parking lot. Email your request to Roxanne Shaw, the parish secretary at:

It is customary to offer a Mass stipend or donation for each mass arranged. The suggested stipend for a weekday Mass is \$15 and \$25 for a Sunday Mass. Thank you for your support.
